2.2. ADMISSIONS

2.4. Evaluation

The examination section, in consultation with the university-departments draws up an annual plan for holding semester/annual examinations at the beginning of any academic year. This plan is followed meticulously and results are announced well in time.

Each of the Papers has a total weight of 100 marks with 70% set aside for university through final qualifying examinations and 30% for continuous internal assessment consisting of tests, seminars and quizzes. Thus, the examinations in the university comprise of two components: external and internal evaluation.

Performance of students in respective subject is based on Letter Grading System which comprise of Continuous Internal Evaluations (CIE) and End Semester Evaluation (ESE). In order to clear

that subject, a student need to secure minimum of 40% score in CIE and ESE considered together for BBA and B.Com (CA) and for M.Com minimum of 50% score in CIE and ESE considered together. Theory Paper for ESE would be of 3 hours duration for a theory subject and practical examination for 2 hours duration for each batch.

There have been provisions made for students by faculty for unit-wise questions to facilities the students preparing for examination. The question set usually requires a reasonable amount of knowledge and skills pertaining to a course in a given unit from a student. We have a transparent system of allowing the students to see their scripts after every internal test and the examiner concerned takes time to discuss with his/her students the nitty-gritty of evaluation.
