TYBBA Div 1 (Finance and Marketing): West Bengal

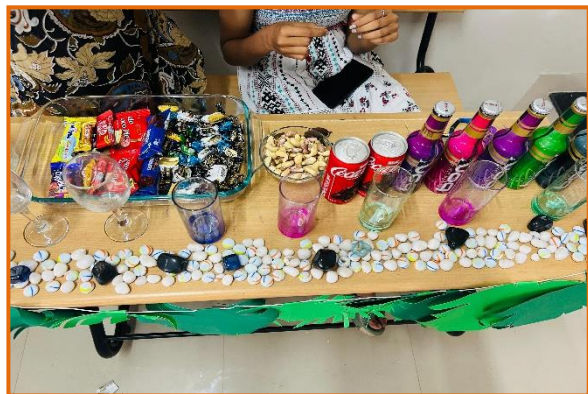
TYBBA Div 2 (IB, HR and Entrepreneurship): Uttar Pradesh
